Training Programme 2021

Online participation across 8 weeks (4th August – 22nd September 2021); ~2 hours of training per week

Training is designed for those participants who are:

- Recently hired or assigned individuals that will be involved in the preparation or reporting of your country's next greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory.
- Individuals with little to no previous GHG inventory training or experience.
- Interested in learning more about GHG inventory measurement and reporting.
- Knowledgeable on how this training might help your country once completed.
- Willing to share knowledge gained with others upon training completion.

Programme Content

The objective of this year's summer academy is to learn and apply GHG inventory data collection, compilation, and documentation procedures. The key focus of each lecture will revolve around improving activity data within GHG inventories.

Each online training week includes \sim 2 hours of training. Instruction will include background reading, exercises, lecture, Q&A discussion forums, and a final assessment. This year the program will foster a virtual training space for participants to train with a country-specific GHG inventory data set. The program requires participation in one scheduled live lecture per week. For those with extenuating circumstances, the live lecture will be recorded for later viewing.



• Week 1: Kick-off, introduction to the MRV Hub, program logistics, introductions, objectives and overview, trainees identify potential datasets

- Week 2: Data collection overview GHG data and parameters
- Week 3: Institutional arrangements overview roles & functions, compilation and documentation
- Week 4: Dataset acquisition, "adapting" datasets for inventory use, dataset documentation
- Week 5: Trainees select own category for academy work, sector-specific data overview
- Week 6: Institutional arrangement drafting, key considerations and sections
- Week 7: Conceptual overview of activity data QA/QC, archiving, and improvement planning
- Week 8: Closing ceremony, online program wrap-up, reception, and announcements of future opportunities
