

CENTRAL AFRICA WOMEN'S INITIATIVE | PROGRAM FACTSHEET FOR CLIMATE ACTION (WICA) | 2024



The U.S. Forest Service International Programs works with Congo Basin governments to sustainably manage forest landscapes and reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. These efforts aim to improve livelihoods, conserve biodiversity, and stabilize the global climate. Currently, the region has few women in technical roles related to natural resource management and climate action. Many countries also face challenges meeting their United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) reporting requirements due to a lack of national GHG accounting experts.

To address these challenges, the U.S. Forest Service International Programs, with funding from the U.S. Department of State's Climate Fellows Program, launched the Central Africa Women's Initiative for Climate Action (WICA) in January 2021. This initiative, which focuses on strengthening women's skills and involvement in climate action, was initially implemented in Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Gabon, and the Republic of the Congo. WICA has since expanded its programs to the Central African Republic and Equatorial Guinea.

Through various activities such as in-person workshops, virtual webinars, self-learning courses, internships, and participation in national and international conferences, WICA participants gain knowledge in GHG accounting under the Enhanced Transparency Framework of the Paris Agreement and deepen their understanding of climate change diplomacy. These activities are carried out in collaboration with regional GHG experts, national partners, and international institutions.

WICA is currently funded by the inter-agency U.S. Government technical assistance program SilvaCarbon, USAID's Central Africa Regional Program for the Environment (CARPE), and the U.S. Forest Service International Programs.


